Jeddah, 05 December 2022: The Red Sea International Film Festival hosted the first 'Celebration of Women in Cinema' gala this week in partnership with Vanity Fair and Chopard at the Park Hyatt, Jeddah to celebrate visionary female talent both on and behind the camera from around the world.

At a gala event hosted alongside the *se*cond edition of the Red Sea International Film Festival, the event brought together working at the heart of the film industry.
